

2012 MASST INCOME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

To be eligible for the MASST program participants must be at least 55 or older and unemployed.

Enrollment priority is given to persons over age 60, veterans, and qualified spouses of veterans.

Preference is then given to minority, limited English-speaking, and Indian eligible individuals.

Preference is also given to eligible individuals who have the greatest economic need.

Note: The State of Alaska and its subrecipients should make particular effort to serve those with “greatest economic needs,” meaning those who are at or below the 100 percent level. The poverty guidelines issued here are a simplified version of the poverty thresholds that the Census Bureau uses to prepare its estimates of the number of individuals and families in poverty accomplished by increasing the latest published Census Bureau poverty thresholds by the relevant percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U).
