

Alaska's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose one-tenth of a percentage point in August to 8.3 percent. July's preliminary rate was revised down one-tenth of a percentage point to 8.2 percent.

The state's unemployment rate has moved very little in the last four months, halting what had been a clear upward trend dating back to early 2007.

The direction of the U.S. rate is less clear. It leveled off at around 9.5 percent for a few months, but then rose to 9.7 percent in August. The nation's unemployment rate has climbed 3.5 percentage points since August 2008 compared to a rate increase of 1.6 percentage points in Alaska.

The state's job count fell slightly in August to an estimated 344,100, primarily due to a typical seasonal decline in seafood processing employment. More telling are the over-the-year comparisons, which show small declines for the fourth month in a row.

Construction, accommodations, retail trade, and food services and drinking places are all down noticeably from their August 2008 levels. All four of those industries have also seen moderate to severe job losses at the national level.

Partially offsetting those losses are over-the-year gains in health care and government. Altogether, the state's August job count was down 900 compared to August 2008, or three-tenths of a percent. Nationally, the losses continue to be more severe with an August over-the-year decline of 6 million jobs, or 4.4 percent.
