Department Holds Workplace Violence Prevention Awareness Training

ANCHORAGE, Alaska— Workplace violence is violence or the threat of violence against workers. The U.S. Department of Labor reports nearly two million American workers are victims of workplace violence each year. Workplace violence can strike anywhere and no one is immune. Although there is no Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standard for workplace violence, OSHA recognizes workplace violence as a workplace hazard. This awareness training will address the following topics:

- The impact of workplace violence

- Identifying aggressive behavior in the workplace
- Hostile work environments
- Bullying in the workplace
- Active shooter (awareness level only)
- Components of a workplace violence prevention plan
